95.2% of US Central respondents reported a willingness to start a business in their current economic environment.

Methodology: The EO Global Entrepreneur Indicator Survey examines the current economic market and realities for entrepreneurs, and gives insight into their predictions for the next six months. More than 4,000 of 12,000+ business owners that comprise the Entrepreneurs' Organization's membership responded to the survey. Respondents represented 160 chapters from 50 countries. Participants were presented with 14 questions assessing current and projected economic health. During the survey period, 1 February – 1 March 2017, responses were obtained by contacting members within each chapter to guide them to the survey materials. Reports were then issued to each of EO's chapters around the world, based on the responses collected from each chapter's members.
